PART A

1. SITUATION OVERVIEW

MV Wakashio (Port of registration Panama) aground at about 1.5 NM off Pointe d'Esny. The vessel was sailing from Singapore to Port Tubarao Brazil on Saturday 25 July 2020. As a result of which the following actions were triggered:

- **Coordination Meeting** chaired by **Commissioner of Police at NCG Ops Room/HQ** on Saturday 25 July 2020 at 22 00 hrs in relation to MV Wakashio aground off Pointe D'Esny and policing deployment. Upon the advice of the Commissioner of Police:
 - (i) **the National Oil Spill Contingency Plan (NOSCP)** was activated by Ministry of Environment on Saturday 25 July 2020; and,
- **NEOC level II** was activated on Saturday 25 July 2020.
- **Coordination Meeting** chaired by **Commissioner of Police** at NCG HQ on Sunday 26 July 2020 at 10 30 hrs in relation to policing operations and deployment by the Police, SMF, NCG, PHS. Members present: Ag CO SMF, DCP Ops, CO PHS, CO NCG, OIC PIOR, Chief Staff Officer Ops NCG, Staff Officer NCG, OIC Police Press and Staff Officer Ops. Then, followed by a **Press Conference** at 12 00 hrs, where members from the media were invited.
- **Incident Command Post** set up at Blue Bay on Sunday 26 July 2020 and is jointly manned by NCG and SMF.
- **National Maritime and Harbour Security Committee** held on Tuesday 28 July 2020 under the Chairmanship of the Secretary for Home Affairs.
- **A Site meeting** held on Friday 31 July 2020 at 13 00 hrs, under Chairmanship of OIC NDRRMC at the Incident Command Post with representatives from SMF, PHS, Blue Bay Police, Polyeco SA Group Co Ltd, Ministry of Environment, NDRRMC and Ministry of Fisheries.
- **Tenth Coordination Meeting** on 'Grounding of MV Wakashio' held on Wednesday 05 August 2020 at 14 00hrs.
- **Sixth National Oil Spill Contingency Plan Coordination Committee** held on Wednesday 05 August 2020 at 13 00 hrs.
- **1st National Crisis Management Committee** chaired by **Hon Prime Minister** held on Thursday 06 August 2020 at 16 00 hrs and will meet daily to monitor the progress in dealing with oil spill.
- **2nd National Crisis Management Committee** chaired by **Hon Vice Prime Minister Mr. Husnoo** held at 15 30 hrs on Friday 07 August 2020 at Pointe D'Esny.

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- A Technical Committee set up at the level of PMO to work on the preparation of the Environmental Emergency Declaration by the PM as per EPA.
- NEOC upgraded to level III at 08 45 hrs on 06.08.2020 as instructed by the Commissioner of Police.
- Press conference held by Minister of Environment and Minister of Blue Economy, Marine Resources, fisheries and Shipping on 06.08.2020 at 17 15 hrs.
- Site Meeting & Operation at ICP on 06.08.2020 : members present: Commissioner of Police, Ag CO SMF /OIC NDRRMC and DCP Ops, CO NCG with the SCR and Salvage Master to take stock of the oil spill situation and decide on the way forward.
- A Technical Committee ICP has been set up to come up with a Plan to deal with oil spill pending arrival of barge and other support. The plan was validated at the meeting held during the night of 06.08.2020 at ICP Blue Bay in presence of the Commissioner of Police.
- LEOC Grand Port has been activated at 09 50 hrs on Thursday 06 August 2020.
- Communiqué issued by Min of Education on 06.08.2020 with respect to closure of school in Mahebourg and surroundings on Friday 07.08.2020.
- Site visit at Honourable Prime Minister at Pointe D'Esny on 07 August 2020.

Forthcoming Meeting

- Eleventh Coordination meeting on 'Grounding of MV Wakashio' scheduled on Saturday 09 August at 09 00hrs.

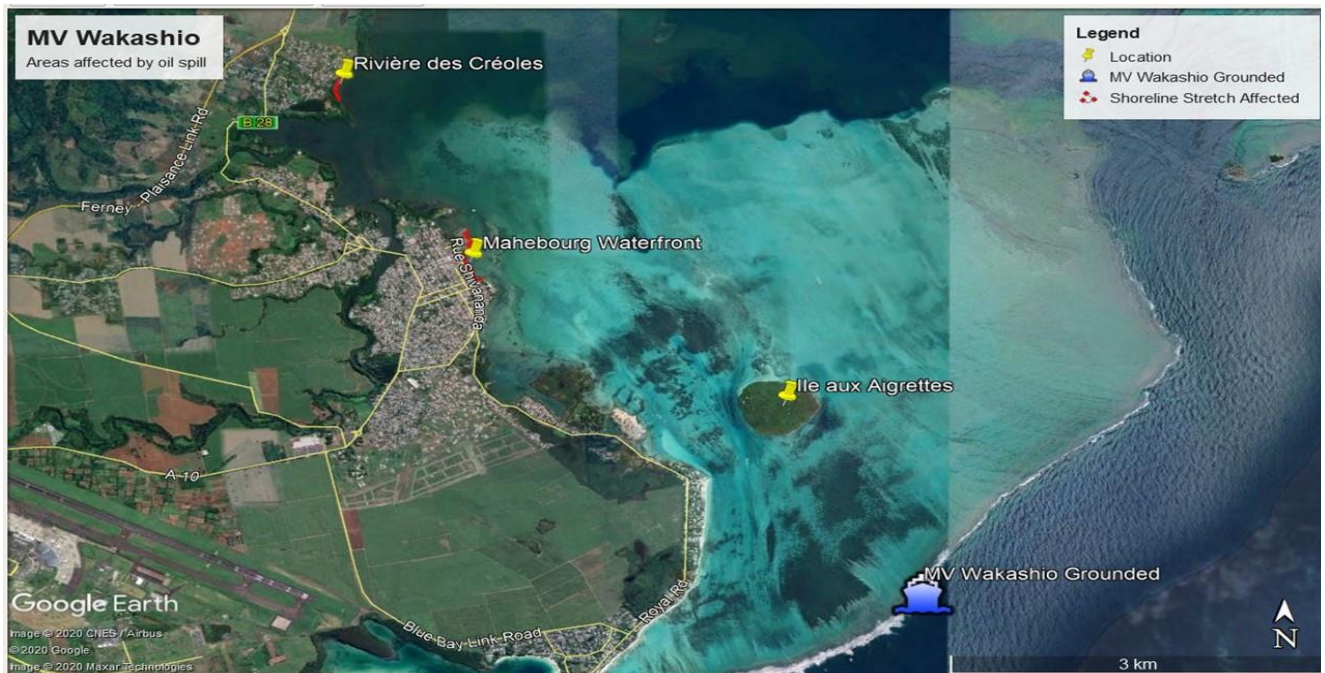

SMF conducting cleaning exercise 07.08.2020

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- PHS carried out 4 sorties, including conveyance of salvage team members to and from MV Wakashio.
- Second PCR COVID 19 tests carried out on 20 crew members of MV Wakashio are negative.
- Vessel condition as at 06 00hrs on 07 August 2020: Engine room, steering gear room, holds no 7,8,9 flooded. Ship almost upright with a list of 0.9 starboard side.
- 255 personnel from the SMF deployed for clean-up of shoreline at Riviere des Creoles.
- 30 LEU staffs deployed for cleaning at Riviere des Creoles.
- 72 staffs from Cleaning Unit of Tourism Authority deployed at Pointe D'Esny and surroundings.
- 39 personnel of SSU deployed at Pointe D'Esny (18 for ground control, 21 deployed)
- Department of Environment carried out a survey at Pointe D'Esny on Friday 07 August 2020 and reported that the beach is clean and the water is clear.
- Department of Environment carried out a survey at Mahebourg waterfront on Friday 07 August 2020 at 09 30hrs and reported that oil spill as well as oil smell has been noted.
- NCG reported 332mt of booms have been relocated in the entrance of marine park on 07 August 2020.
- On 07 August 2020, buoys have been placed and additional 125mt booms from Vivo Energy have been placed to secure the marine park.
- Polyeco SA has placed 315mt booms and 100mt sorbent booms at Pointe D'Esny.
- SMF has placed 180mt boom and 100mt sorbent boom at Sand Quarry.
- MPA has placed 200mt boom at Point Brocus and 100 mt booms have been placed at Mahebourg Waterfront.
- Polyeco SA has deployed 4 boats at Pointe D'Esny. 1 boat contains oil skimmer and the other 3 contain 2 IBC tank of 1000L each. The oil skimmer is being used for pumping of floated oil and is being filled in the IBC tank. The oil in the IBC tanks are then being pumped out on shore into the lorries deployed by Virgin Oil for carting away to the depot of Virgin Oil at Montagne Blanche.
- On 07 August 2020, Eco fuel, Sotravic and Seeven are also deploying lorries for carting away of pumped oil to the compound of Eco Fuel at Pointe aux Sables.
- Solid Waste Management reported that 57 tons of oil have been pumped at Pointe D'Esny as at 17 30hrs on 07 August 2020.
- Seeven pumped 10000L of oil at Riviere des Creoles and 21000L of oil at Mahebourg Waterfront on 07 August 2020.
- Sotravic pumped 30000L of oil at Mahebourg Waterfront on 07 August 2020.
- 14 personnel of DRU and Engineer Squadron deployed at Riviere Des Creoles.
- MFRS on standby at Mahebourg.

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- SMF engineer assisted ECO Fuel Ltd for pumping out of 12000L of oily liquid from sea water at Riviere des Creoles. Same supervised by Solid Waste Management.
- Arrangement made with ENGEN (Mt Elise) and INDIAN OIL (Tresta Star) to despatch 1 barge each for pumping out of oil from sea water.

3. Actions undertaken by NEOC

- NEOC level II upgraded to Level III at 08hr45 on 06 August 2020 as per instructions from the Commissioner of Police.
- Liaison made with Solid Waste Management to arrange with Polyeco SA and Virgin Oil for the collection, storage and disposal of waste. It is to be noted that Polyeco SA is already the environmental arm of the Salvage Team.
- Mr Ramdenee of VIVO Energy has been requested to deploy his available resources in support to NCG.
- Waste Water Authority had been requested to see if whether they have any logistics available that could be used to assist in response to the oil spill.
- MFRS has been requested to remain available and to identify if whether they can assist in response to the oil spill in term providing of equipment and resources if required.
- **Members present in NEOC on 07 August 2020: NCG, PIOR, SMF, SSU, Traffic Branch, MFRS, Ministry of Local Government and Disaster Risk Management, Ministry of Health and Wellness, Ministry of Environment, Solid Waste Management and Climate Change (Department of Environment), Solid Waste Management Division, Mauritius Red Cross Society, Mauritius Ports Authority, Ministry of Blue Economy, Marine Resources, Fisheries and Shipping, Business Mauritius.**
- Mr Ramlaggan from Business Mauritius provided information regarding some additional logistic support in term of oil spill equipment from private companies such as Vivo Energy, MEXA, MCA amongst others.
- Mr. Ramlaggan from Business Information informed that ENGEN Ltd will provide Personal Protective Equipment.
- One Skimmer and one power pack for the MPA has been deployed at the ICP upon request from the Ministry of Environment on 07 August 2020.
- PIOR requested to arrange for additional policing and crowd control by Southern Division and Traffic Branch.
- On 07 August 2020, all Local Authorities and concerned stakeholders have provided a list of all equipment and resources available for support if required at short notice, at their end. (Annex B)

- They were given full Personnel Protection Equipment (PPE) outfit and equipment.
- Their COVID tests performed on them, revealed to be negative.
- A medical team (a Doctor, a Nursing Officer & an Attendant) is present at Astroea Hotel.
- A total of 20 MV Wakashio crew members are quarantined at Belle Mare Recreational centre. A second PCR Covid-19 test effected on 06.08.2020 and the result are negative.
- On 07 August 2020, 3 PHS staff have been released after COVID 19 test was negative.
